9. CREW MEALS

All crew are able to purchase meals for **\$12 per day per person** (regardless of which meals are actually required on any given day). **Families are \$24 per day** and include children 15 years and under if both parents are working as full time crew. You will need to pre-pay your meals before the cut off date (cash, credit, cheque and direct deposit accepted). If you wish you can bring your own meals in to the crew area and eat with the rest of the crew. Soft drinks are also available for purchase.

Crew meals can only be booked or changed up to 5pm, 18 March 2010. You will need to have paid for whatever you are booked in for before this point to 'lock in' your order (not negotiable). Meals are transferable. Water, tea and coffee will always be available for all crew at no cost in the crew shelter. Seconds of meals not necessarily available but portions will be generous.

Breakfast – Available for crew living onsite – includes cereals, toast and whole fruit.

Lunch – Light meal i.e. salad roll, hot dog, foccacia etc.

Dinner – Main meal i.e. beef stroganoff, sweet and sour pork, roast, bangers and mash etc and dessert.

Due to the numbers of crew being catered for, we are unable to offer options or look after specific dietary requirements. If you are not sure that you are able to work with our catering menu you are encouraged to provide your own meals and utilise the crew shelter and microwave.

PRE-EVENT CREW MANUAL

Thanks for offering your time and skills to help make Easterfest 2010 an amazing festival. Easterfest could not have become the event that it is without the hundreds of crew members that have been involved over the past 11 years!

Presented here are some important details that you need to be aware of before you sign up for and arrive at Easterfest.

As a crew member you are a representative of Easterfest. You could be the first crew member that a member of the public meets, so smile and make them feel welcome.

By submitting your application/registration for Easterfest crew you agree to follow and abide by the guidelines set out in this manual.

QUALIFICATIONS

You must be at least 15 years of age to work on crew at Easterfest. Some roles will require specific licenses/qualifications ie fork lift drivers etc.

CREW EXPECTATIONS

- As a crew member it is expected that you fulfill your duty associated with your position. Unreliable crew members will be released from their duties and any future opportunities.
- Please be polite with all band members, crew, and festival patrons at all times.
- Easterfest is a festival based on Christian values and it is important that your involvement in the festival reflects these values. We understand that everyone is in a different place regarding these issues but we ask that you are respectful of the variety of Christian viewpoints that will be represented at the festival.
- Please treat everyone, from Easterfest crew, the public and artists, with respect. If issues arise that cannot be courteously resolved please contact your team leader.
- If any issues arise and you are unable to perform your role at any time during the festival, contact your team leader as soon as possible so that alternative arrangements can be made.

SMOKING, DRUGS AND ALCOHOL

- **EASTERFEST IS A DRUG AND ALCOHOL FREE SITE. NO EXCEPTIONS.** Any person found intoxicated or in possession of alcohol will be removed from site.
- The Easterfest precinct is a non smoking area. Smoking areas are available outside the Easterfest precinct or within the crew area. Smoking is permitted inside the crew area, however please consider others and stay at least 10 meters away from any entrance to a tent, site shed or shipping container.

ACCESS

- The camping area is for campers only. If you are not camping please do not enter the camping area unless you are instructed to do so by your team leader.
- The backstage areas of all Easterfest venues are very busy and congested. No one is allowed backstage unless they work on that stage or have festival business with that stage.
- The green room area is a private place for headline artists to relax without being hassled. **Do not enter the green room area** unless instructed to do so by your supervisor.
- If you are working in a position that is with or around artists, please do not abuse your position by asking for autographs or allowing your family and friends access to artists or restricted areas. This type of position is a privilege, not a right.

COMMUNICATIONS

If you are issued with a radio, take good care of it. If you abuse it, it will be taken away. Radios and replacement batteries can be collected from the communications centre near the crew shelter. You will only receive a radio if your team leader has requested one for you.

BUMP IN & OUT

- A high visibility jacket/vest must be worn at all times during bump-in and bump-out. You may also be required to wear a high visibility vest on certain jobs if you are crewing during the event (e.g. traffic crew). Vests are available from the crew registration counter at the box office
- **Closed-in shoes are required during bump-in and bump-out.** Closed-in shoes may also be necessary for certain areas during the event.
- During bump-in and bump-out, forklifts, cars and trucks will be driving through the Queen's Park site. Please be aware of these vehicles.

SITE SAFETY

Site safety is a very important part of crewing at Easterfest. During the setup and pack down stage of the festival, Queen's Park is classed as a construction site and therefore these site safety procedures must be followed:

- During the event free earplugs will be available for all crew working in a venue with loud amplified music.
- Free sunscreen will be available to all crew - so slip on a shirt, slop on sunscreen, slap on a hat and shade your eyes.
- All crew will receive a free bottle of water upon registering for the first time at Easterfest, please keep this bottle for the duration of the event. Crew water refill stations will be located throughout the site.
- Please don't lift anything over 20kg by yourself. If something seems too heavy then it is. Ask for help if you think a task is going to be difficult.
- All vehicles driving on site are limited to 5kph. This is to keep dust levels and park damage to a minimum and also to ensure the safety of on-site crew. Vehicle hazard lights must be on when driving on site. Traffic should be restricted to the ring road - enter from Margaret Street and exit onto Hume Street.
- Tractors, scooters, quad bikes etc. are not to be used by anyone except authorised crew members. Rubbish tractors are only to be driven by the rostered drivers.
- For health and safety reasons we ask that you wear gloves if you are picking up rubbish or changing bins. These are available at the crew registration desk.
- All electrical equipment used on-site must be tested and tagged before going on site.
- **If you are concerned about your's or another's safety at Easterfest please immediately contact your team leader or event coordinator.**

EMERGENCY

If an emergency is immediately life threatening call 000 then contact the call centre; if the emergency is not life threatening simply contact the call centre.

- The first aid tent is located inside the Entry Pavilion near the main festival entry.
- During bump-in and bump-out, contact the call centre for a first aid person to meet you at the first aid tent or at the incident.
- A qualified Queensland Ambulance officer will be on duty at the first aid tent during festival hours.
- Due to health regulations we are unable to give out painkillers. Please ensure you are well stocked with paracetamol if you know you may need some. Paracetamol will be on sale at the Superstore.
- In the event of an emergency situation, an emergency warden in each of the festival precincts and venues will be empowered to stop a show or evacuate a venue only if there is an immediate physical danger to attendees, artists and crew.

PARKING

Unfortunately crew car parking is not available on Queen's Park. Please don't park on the local residential streets surrounding Queen's Park as thousands of car parks are available in the Toowoomba CBD and are just a few minutes walk to the festival.

COMPLAINTS/COMPLIMENTS

- If you receive positive or negative feedback about the festival please refer the person to the information desk.
- All festival operation issues should be referred to the call centre. Call centre will then inform you if you need to forward the complaint to Information. If you are unsure of what to do you should contact the call centre.

SECURITY

If you encounter a problem with hard to handle people, do not attempt to handle the situation by yourself. Call your team leader, security or a police officer to manage the problem.

MEDIA

Hundreds of media representatives attend Easterfest. It is important that all media seeking stories, updates or even just comments are directed to the media team. If you are unsure of how to best direct a media representative to the Easterfest media team, contact the call centre.

DISCRIMINATION, SEXUAL HARASSMENT & ABUSE

Easterfest is committed to a safe, enjoyable and non-discriminatory event. No person is expected to tolerate any discrimination, sexual harassment or abuse of any kind. If you witness or are the subject of any discrimination, sexual harassment or abuse of any kind please immediately contact Heather Woodcraft, Crew Manager.
